'Allenby's Palestine Campaign 1917-1918 Logistics, Manoeuvre, Success'

**A talk by Colonel A K Miller CBE—In aid of Aberdalgie Church Development and
The Friends of St Andrew's Jerusalem**

Thursday, 9th April 2020 at 7:00 pm Forteviot Village Hall—Entrance £5

Drawing on the feats of Scottish Soldiers, notably those of the 52nd Lowland Division, this talk focusses on the success achieved by Allenby's Expeditionary Force that fought from the Battle of Gaza to Aleppo between September 1917 until November 1918.

St Andrew's Memorial Church, Jerusalem was built to commemorate the campaign. The foundation stone was laid in 1927 by General Allenby and support for its construction came from parishes across Scotland, including Forteviot. Today it is central to representing the Church of Scotland's presence in the Holy Land.

Colonel A K Miller served for 34 years in The Argylls and ended his career as the British Defence Attache in Israel in 2007. He is currently involved with the redevelopment of The Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders Regimental Museum in Stirling Castle. He lives in our parish.


